Confirmation is doing a 5 week study on the Lord’s Prayer. Today’s lessons focuses on the phrase: “Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.” The objectives of this session are to:

- ~realize that we are pray to God as a child speaks to a loving parent who forgives, comforts, guides, and provides for our needs
- ~ feel connected to God in an intimate way so that we seek to honor God’s name in all we say and do
- ~make the Lord’s Prayer a consistent part of our prayer lives and consider ways that it can affect the ways we live out our faith.

Students and Parents: Jesus taught us the Lord’s Prayer. He encourages us to talk with God the same way we talk to a trusted friend or loving parent. In fact, when Jesus prayed, the word he used for Father was Abba meaning Daddy or Papa. What are names you call your:
